HORTICULTURE

It might be winter but the Horticulture Group are not dormant;we're currently planning what to grow for the sunnier days of spring and summer! You should soon see the spring bulbs we planted in late autumn popping up here and there but to follow this, we reckon that for the village entrance planters, the Napier Hall beds, a few hanging baskets and the new and extended beds that the Council are digging for us, we will need about 350 plants to provide seasonal colour and interest - a mixture of low growing shrubs, perennials and annuals.

We have overwintered some things in the greenhouse at Dalnottar, plan a shopping trip to a wholesale nursery and will be growing some things from seed and adding spare plants from our own gardens - all offers of plants welcomed. Spending the last of our Awards For All grant money, we're also buying some watering equipment in order that we don't have to rely on buckets and the patience of the shopkeepers!
